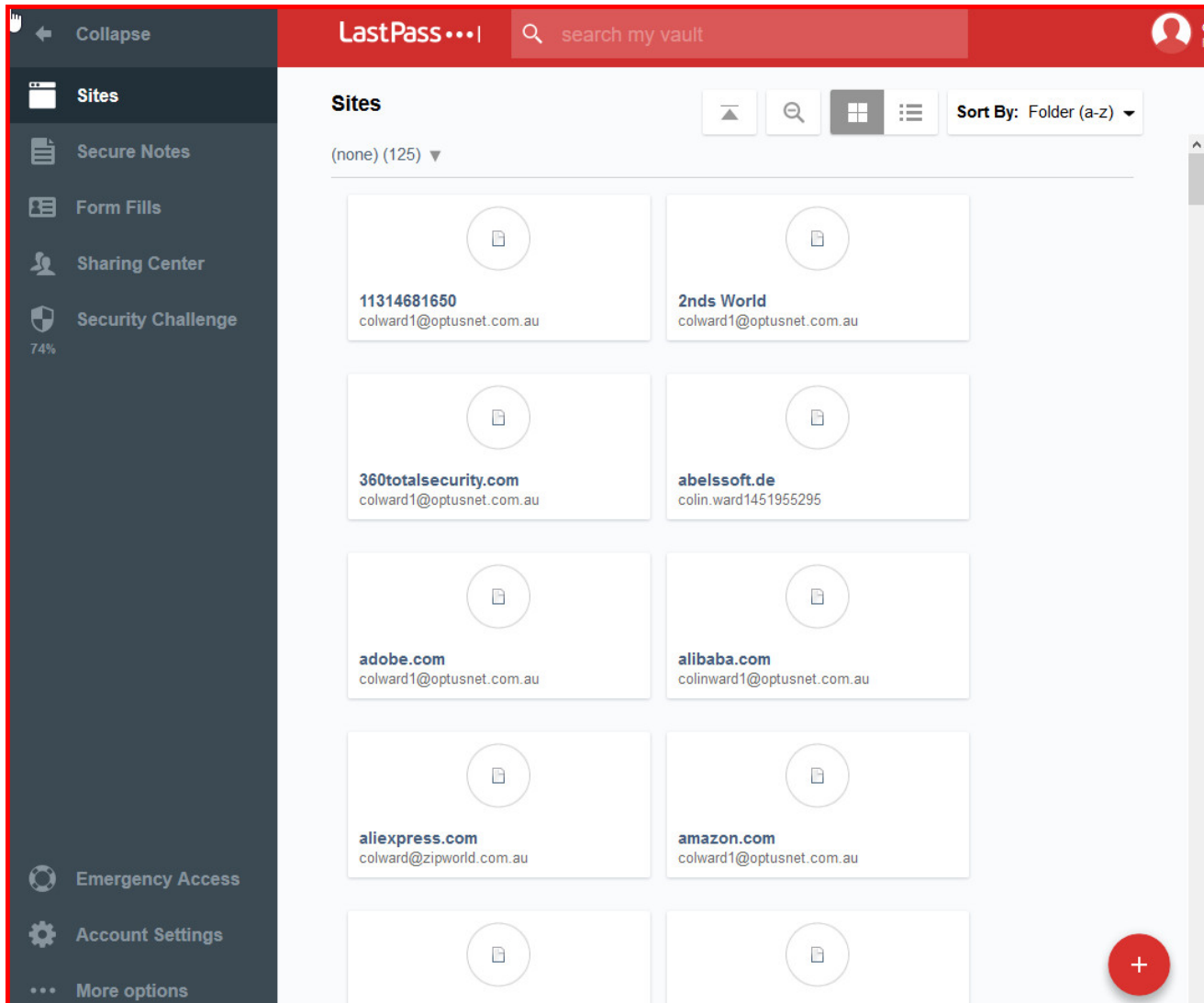


Use a Password Manager.
