**TWO GLASSES OF WINE**

### **Word Toolbars**

#### ***Creating your own toolbar***

Step 1: Click on View → Toolbars → Customise.

Step 2: The Customize window opens. Click on New.

Step 3: The New Toolbar window opens.

Step 4: Put in a Name under Toolbar Name and Click OK. Don't change "Make toolbar available to Normal".

Step 5: When you click OK a small window appears. It will show the first 2 letters of your new toolbar + ▾ & x.

Step 6: Your Customize window will now have a new entry.

Step 7: Click on the "Commands" Tab.

Step 8: Click on first **Category** and you'll see a list of **Commands**. Click on as **Command** and, holding the Mouse (left) button down drag "New" to the pale area on the new toolbar, below the heading.

You'll see it become visible.

Repeat above Step 8 for each icon you require.

Step 9: Select the next category. Repeat Above after selecting it.

Step 10: Is a repeat of Step 9. As you select a Category select only the Commands you use most frequently.

Remember even if you forget one now, it can always be added later.

Finished Toolbar:

In position: Drag the toolbar by left clicking on the left edge; (it will turn into a 4 headed arrow) and place it under the current toolbars.

Removing old Toolbars: To remove old toolbar go to **View** then **Toolbars** remove the ticks beside the ones you no longer need.

That's what you're left with, your very own custom toolbar.
