This MS Word feature can be very helpful, however if you dislike the change Autocorrect offers, all you need to do is press Backspace and the suggestion vanishes. You can also remove that suggestion permanently by opening Tools, then Autocorrect Options, selecting and then deleting the offender.

THE THREE Rs ARE BECOMING BETTER KNOWN

REDUCE, REUSE AND RECYCLE are the catchwords to encourage us all to help reduce the national environmental footprint, but few of us ever actually make the effort to act on those words.

The computer/electronic area is one where we can do something positive. Did you know that about 2.4 MILLION computers are dumped to landfill every year in Australia? What did you do with your old computer, or its peripherals, or your old TV, VCR, or microwave oven, for that matter? Put it out for a council collection and subsequent dumping in your local landfill site?

1800EWASTE is an enterprising "E-Waste" collection service that comes to your home, collects the electronic junk and takes it to a special end-of-life recycling plant on the Central Coast, where a great deal of the waste is recycled after stripping down each unit. As a result, about 90% of the material is saved from being tossed into a tip.

Computer kits contain about 23% of plastic, 32% of ferrous metals, 18% of non-ferrous metals, 12% of motherboards (with gold and other precious metals) and some 18% of glass, by weight. Now I know that adds up to 103%, but it is only approximate! The point is, most of the material is recycled and only a small portion goes to landfill. This produces a double benefit, firstly landfills last longer, saving we ratepayers money and secondly, natural resources are conserved, aiding the environment and the future users of resources, including your grandchildren perhaps.

For an average home the cost of this service is about \$66 and is readily arranged by phoning 1800EWASTE's national phone line 1800 392 783. Or you can visit their website www.ewaste.com.au/about-us.php for more information.

(Since preparing this item, **1800EWASTE** have agreed to allow Forest Computer Pals members 10 % discount for the month of March. If members wish to accept this offer, on ringing the company be sure to tell them you are from Forest Computer Pals and that Mr Tim Waters had authorised the discount.)
