President Colin Ward opened the meeting, welcoming all.

MINUTES OF GENERAL MEETING 26TH FEBRUARY, 2009.

PDF reader required for Forest News: Best is www.foxitsoftware.com can be downloaded for free. (1/10th size of Adobe Reader)

Must Have for All: Anti Virus (remember you can only use one) set to 'Auto Update" so that when you go online (and do at least once a week) you will be automatically updated. Free programs: Avast and AVG

Spyware – Can use 2 until Anti Virus: All need updating weekly. This gets rid of tracking cookies; Ad-Aware Free (Anniversary Ed.) A Squared 4.0.0.38 ; CCleaner 2.16.830; Spybot (New Version 1.6.2) .

Free-Firewall Programs:- use only 1 – turn off Windows Fire Wall or remove any other first; Zone Alarm (XP/Vista) – Auto check for new version. Comada 1.0.0.6 Full suite (under Full Suites.

All in One: Kaspersky Internet Suite 2009 – rated No1 by PC User and APC Magazines; McAfee ASAP Monitored Suite – Installation is through Hi-Speed or Club – i.e. contact Collin Ward; Trend Micro Suite; Comodo 1.0.0.6 Full Suite.

Colin was asked to supply a CD of all free software: Instead it may go onto My Document Drive where those with USBs can access it easily. These are .exe or .zip files and can then be installed on your home machines.

Colin noted that there were 24 people in arrears for 6 months who will be removed from the list of members.

GUEST SPEAKER: Our wonderful local guest speaker Rod Duckworth asked the audience for questions and proceeded to talk about a variety of subjects; Controversially his business customers have not taken to Vista and often 'upgrade' back to XP- hopefully Windows 7 will be better. XP is a far more stable platform, clean and fast whilst Vista can have speed and security issues. The latter for business networks not individual users. He addressed the difficulty of File Sharing (beginnings of networking) where the material needs to be in a 'shared documents' folder. to share across an internal network of computers.

He tried to make us more aware of the complexity of language used for make web sites (although new software no longer requires this understanding.) He showed us the complexity of a simple sentence by looking at Properties when 'hello how are you' was typed into Notepad which used only 17 bytes compared with 24,000 bytes in Word due to the markers and codes used in the latter program that we were totally unaware of. Thank goodness we no longer need to know web page language. I was fascinated to see him drop a file into the web browser simply by drag and dropping onto browser on the task bar!

He warned that those using Bit Torrent to download free Music and Movies were in danger of being caught and should use free software- 'Peer Guardian' which needs to updates daily and blocks Sony and others interested in catching you from tracing your location.
