 Warringah Council		<p>COMPRESSING & ZIPPING</p> <p>To start with both terms mean the same. Documents (files in computer speak), folders and pictures can be compressed to save space on your computer. Compressed folders can be readily "un-compressed or de-compressed", or transferred to other computers.</p> <p>For those with Windows 7 as their operating system, Microsoft provides a good website with even a video to explain how to compress and decompress. HOW MUCH A YEAR DO YOU SPEND ON INK FOR YOUR PRINTER?

According to a survey run by CHOICE COMPUTER recently ("The real cost of ink", CHOICE COMPUTER, Jan/Feb, 2011), the cost of ink over a three year period may be 4 or 5 times the original cost of the printer itself!

Inks are a major operating cost for computer users, particularly when "original" inks are used.

There are several alternatives, such as buying generic inks, buying from specialist suppliers, installing a continuous ink system, refilling cartridges yourself, buying online from "Wholesalers", or even just buying a new printer! Not using original inks can cause problems if warranties are involved, but all the generic suppliers claim their inks will not cause printer problems. You can often reduce ink consumption by choosing "Fast" or "Draft" in "Properties", and "Grayscale". This will print everything in black and shades of grey, using no coloured inks. And of course, you can choose to read documents on the screen and not print them at all! That saves ink and paper. (That's one of the reasons why we send the Newsletter to most members by email. Let us know if you'd like to get your copy by email.)

We recently discovered that Wholesale Toners Australia, based in Queensland, offer a very speedy postal ink service for both original and generic inks for most computers, but more usefully for club members, they offer a 10% discount on list prices for seniors. If you would like to try them out their website is www.WholesaleTone.com.au, or phone 1300 112 079. Don't forget to tell them you're a senior! Their Express Mail service is very prompt.

We would like to hear from members about their experiences with inks – whether they use originals, generics, or fill their own cartridges. If we get enough responses, we'll publish the consensus in the newsletter, without mentioning names of members of course, but we would consider naming good suppliers.
